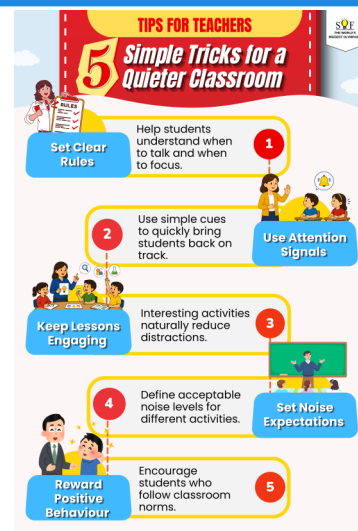
Why Do Chilled Onions Make You Cry Less?

Have you noticed that cutting a cold onion often causes fewer tears? That's because low temperatures **slow down the chemical reaction** that releases the tear-triggering compounds.

When you cut an onion, it releases a compound called syn-propanethial-S-oxide, which reaches your eyes and causes irritation, making them produce tears. Cooling the onion slows this process, reducing the effect.

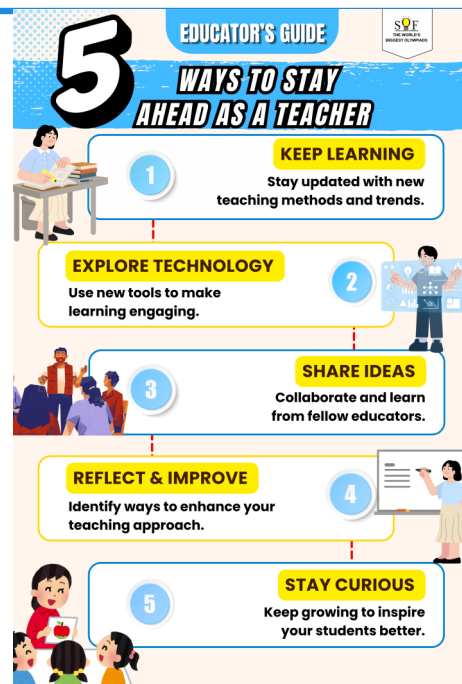

Why Does the First Rain After Summer Smell Different?

Have you ever noticed the fresh, earthy smell when the first rain arrives after a long dry season? This smell is called petrichor.

When raindrops hit dry soil, they release geosmin, a natural compound produced by soil bacteria, along with oils released from plants. These tiny chemical reactions create the refreshing smell we associate with the first rain.

Scientists study petrichor to understand how natural compounds interact with the environment. So, the smell of rain is not just pleasant—it is a fascinating example of science happening all around us.

What Would Happen If Microorganisms Disappeared?

Microorganisms may be tiny, but they play a huge role in keeping Earth balanced. They help break down waste, recycle nutrients in soil, support plant growth, and are even used to make products like yogurt and medicines.

Without microorganisms, ecosystems would struggle, waste would accumulate, and many natural processes essential for life would be disrupted. They also help maintain the balance of our environment and support life in ways we often don't notice.

Why Lemon Juice Prevents Browning?

Have you noticed that apples, bananas, or potatoes turn brown after being cut? This happens because the exposed surface reacts with oxygen in the air through a process called oxidation.

Lemon juice contains vitamin C (ascorbic acid), which acts as an antioxidant. It slows down this chemical reaction by reducing the effect of oxygen, helping fruits maintain their fresh colour for longer.

A simple kitchen trick uses the power of chemistry to slow down a natural reaction!



ASTRONOMY FACT

Do You Know Why Satellites Don't Fall Back to Earth?

It may seem surprising, but satellites are actually always falling toward Earth because of gravity. However, they are moving forward at such a high speed that while they fall, they keep missing Earth's surface and continue travelling around the planet.

This balance between Earth's gravitational pull and the satellite's forward motion creates an orbit. The satellite keeps following a curved path around Earth instead of crashing down.

A satellite stays in space because it is constantly falling - but never falling into Earth!
