Bees Can Recognize Human Faces

Bees may have tiny brains, but they are surprisingly intelligent! Research shows that bees use pattern recognition to identify shapes—and this ability can extend to recognizing human faces as well.

Instead of seeing faces the way humans do, bees break them down into patterns of light, shape, and contrast, helping them distinguish one image from another.

Assign responsibilities that require teamwork, not just speaking.

Ask Thinking Questions

Ask Questions like “Can you explain this in a simpler way?” to build reflection.

Why Does a Mirror Fog Up After a Hot Shower?

When you take a hot shower, the water heats the surrounding air, creating warm water vapour (steam) in the bathroom. When this steam touches the cooler surface of the mirror, it rapidly cools down and turns back into tiny water droplets.

Scientific Connection: This process is called condensation - when water vapour in the air changes into liquid form due to a drop in temperature

That's why your mirror looks foggy- but it's actually covered with millions of tiny water droplets!

What Would Happen If Mammoths Never Went Extinct?

Imagine if woolly mammoths were still walking the Earth today! In cold regions like the Arctic tundra, they would likely be shaping the land just like they once did - trampling snow, grazing on grass, and keeping forests from spreading too much.

Without their presence in history, ecosystems slowly changed. But if they were still around, they could help maintain open grasslands and even influence how frozen soil (permafrost) behaves.

Scientific Connection:

Mammoths were keystone species, meaning their presence had a big impact on keeping the ecosystem balanced.

VOCABULARY BOOST

What does "Suboptimal" mean?

Meaning: Not at the best or most effective level; below ideal performance.

Example:

- Studying only the night before exams is a suboptimal way to prepare.
- A suboptimal diet can affect energy levels and concentration.
- Using a suboptimal method to solve a problem may take more time than necessary.

? DO YOU KNOW?

Too Much Salt Makes You Thirsty

When you eat salty food, the salt increases the concentration of sodium in your blood. This disturbs the water balance in your body, as water moves out of your cells to dilute the salt.

Your brain quickly detects this change and activates the **thirst response**, signaling you to drink water to restore balance.

That's why salty snacks like chips or fries always make you reach for water!



ASTRONOMY FACT

Why Rockets Launch in Stages

Rockets are built in multiple stages because carrying all the fuel at once would make them extremely heavy and difficult to lift off the ground.

At launch, the rocket uses the first stage to break free from Earth's gravity. Once that fuel is used up, the empty section is detached and dropped away, making the rocket lighter and easier to push further into space. Then the next stage takes over.

Scientific Connection: This works on the idea that reducing mass increases efficiency and speed, allowing rockets to travel much farther with limited fuel
